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

Seasonal Dock Slip Application

If you plan to rent an Association dock slip this year for exclusive in-water parking of your boat, you must apply by April 1, 2024. An application must be submitted each year.

The seasonal dock slip fee for members is \$525 per marina area slip and \$555 for a subdivision slip near your home.

No overnight parking is allowed at the main dock located in front of the clubhouse.

All those that apply will be notified in April of the placement areas and will need to forward payment in full to receive their current sticker. (Association dues must be paid in full to be eligible for a dock slip.) There is always the possibility that more members will apply for a dock slip than the number of slips available. So, there is no guarantee that all members that apply for a dock slip will be assigned a slip.

Please DO NOT send payment until you are notified of your dock slip assignment.

BEFORE APPLYING please read and acknowledge the following:

- 1. When assigning slips, priority is given to non-waterfront members, as this is their only opportunity to park their boat in-water. (Waterfront owners may apply for an Association slip and will be granted one if a slip is available. But, when a non-waterfront member requests a slip in the same area, that member would get the slip before the waterfront owner.)
- 2. If there are more requests for slips at any dock than there are slips available, we will hold a lottery drawing for slips for that particular dock. Should you not be drawn for your preferred dock and you do not specify a second and third preference, you will not automatically be assigned a slip.
 - If a lottery drawing is held for a specific dock, one entry per lot owned by the applicant will be placed in the lottery. However, only one slip will be assigned to the applicant.
- 3. In many areas there is a high demand for slips. It is in your best interest to specify first, second, third choices if you have them. You will have a better chance of getting a dock slip.
- 4. Requests for a particular slip at any dock are not guaranteed. We must serve all members who apply by assigning slips according to boat type and size. It is important that applicants fill out the application completely and accurately for this reason.
- 5. Weather permitting docks are in place by mid-May each year. Due to weather and seasonal maintenance schedules, docks will be moved to their winter locations beginning the first week of October. All slips must be vacated by October 13, 2024 to enable maintenance staff to complete this work. \$50 per day additional fee will be assessed for any boats not removed by deadline date.
- 6. Marina docks have no access before 8 a.m. and after 10 p.m. when the main clubhouse gates are closed.
- 7. If rules are not followed, dock privileges will be immediately revoked and no refund will be given.



Greenway Utilization Rules

The greenway is considered one of the great membership benefits of the Dutch Hollow Property Owners' Association. The greenway consists of about 700 acres and includes nearly two thirds of the shoreline. Not only does it create a community nestled between woods, prairies, and grasslands, it also creates an opportunity for members and their families to enjoy the Lake and our surrounding nature. The greenway is owned by <u>all</u> of the members through the Association and the set of rules below are intended to allow <u>everyone</u> to enjoy the benefit of the greenway in a safe, practical and respectful manner.

- I. It is up to each property owner to know where their property boundaries are and where the greenway begins and ends.
- II. Permanent use of the greenway for such things as storage or parking of personal property is NOT permitted.
- III. Campfires are not permitted on the greenway.
- IV. Permitted temporary greenway usage:
 - A. The greenways may be used for such items as kayaks, canoes, paddleboards, which may be stored in greenway areas to promote the enjoyment of the greenway and Lake, following the requirements below:

B. Requirements:

- 1. Items may not be stored within 20 feet of the Ordinary High Water Mark.
- 2. Items may not interfere with other members' use of the greenway.
- 3. Items on the greenway may be used while the Association docks are in the water after which the stored items need to be removed.
- 4. Items need to be neatly stored when not in use.
- 5. Stored items may not cause damage to the greenway and must be elevated above the ground allowing for air flow thus limiting shading and killing of the vegetative cover.
- 6. The Association reserves the right to remove and dispose of any items that are located on the greenway in an unsafe manner or remain on the greenway beyond the boating season.
- V. Maintenance

The greenway will not be maintained by the Association except where the Board decides it is in the best interest of all members. Members may <u>minimally</u> maintain the greenway by mowing paths and small picnic areas.

- A. Guidelines/Requirements:
 - 1. Members may not mow within 20' of the shoreline.
 - 2. Paths should be kept to no wider than 60".
 - 3. Mowed areas may be cut no shorter than 4".
 - 4. Where practical, members should work with neighbors to minimize paths.
 - 5. On steep slopes of > 10% the path should be mowed in a serpentine or switch back configuration to help control storm water run-off and to avoid mower tire rutting of the mowed grass.
 - 6. Mowed picnic areas shall not exceed 250 square feet in size and needs prior approval by the Association manager. No permanent items (tables, chairs, benches, etc.) may be left in any picnic area without the prior approval of the Association Manager. Any approved permanent items left in a picnic area will be open to the use of all of the members of the Association.
 - 7. Timber harvesting of the greenway is not permitted without the written permission of the Association.
- VI. Vehicle use on greenway
 - A. Vehicles are not allowed on the greenway except as defined below:
 - 1. Vehicles with turf tires are allowed ONLY to access a dock.
 - 2. Care should be taken to avoid damage to the vegetation.
 - 3. Vehicles are not to be driven on dock access pathways or greenway during rain and 24 hours after rain.
 - 4. Vehicles may not block dock access paths.
 - 5. Vehicle speed may not exceed 5mph on any greenway areas.

The Board reserves the right to change, modify or limit access to the greenways in the future as necessary.

Legal Disclaimer:

The Association is not responsible for any damage or loss of property that is left on the greenway. Further, the Association is not responsible for damage to your equipment, or injury while maintaining the greenway.

Friends of Dutch Hollow Lake is a Qualified Lake Association that was formed in February 2020. This group was formed to preserve and protect a lake and its surroundings, and to enhance the water quality, fishery, boating safety, and aesthetic value of a lake.

- Friends of DHL membership and dues are voluntary.
- Dues are to be paid on a calendar year basis.
- Qualified Lake Association (FDHL) has <u>no powers</u> over the lake <u>community residents.</u>
- <u>Membership is limited</u> to those people with an interest in protecting the lake. It is limited to individual, family, business, or organizations that: <u>Own or lease property</u> within <u>one mile</u> of the lake. Reside on or within <u>one mile</u> <u>of the lake</u> at least one month each year.
- Incorporated under Section 181 of the Wisconsin Statutes to be eligible for DNR or state funding.
- Incorporated as a tax-exempt 501(c)(3) organization so that <u>contributions are tax deductible.</u>

Before the group was formed, the Dutch Hollow Lake Property Owners' Association (DHLPOA) performed all the functions of a Qualified Lake Association. However, a Property Owners' Association does not qualify for DNR and State grants so, the Association paid for all the costs associated with protecting the Lake.



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

Thank you for paying your 2024 Association dues!

Member cards for use during the main season will be mailed out to you by early May!

Member Cards are used to identify members when using the amenities at Dutch Hollow Lake. This also allows Management to easily identify nonmembers utilizing Dutch Hollow amenities.

How the Member Cards will be used:

As a member, (when you are <u>present</u> with your family/guests) you will be required to show the following when using amenities:

Pool – Member Card and Season Pool Pass (show lifeguard)

Tennis/Pickleball – Member Card and Season Tennis/Pickleball Pass (Post on clip board on Tennis Court fence.)

Beach –Member Card (Manager will make rounds and ask for identification.)

Members (when you are <u>not present</u> with your guests) having guests are required to notify the Association Office in advance. In order for a guest to use the amenities, guests will be required to stop by office and receive a daily guest pass. Members must call in guests to office or they will not be issued a daily guest pass, the guest will have to pay the non-member daily fee.

It is important to follow the rules to maintain the safety and beauty for everyone at DHL.

- No camping on vacant lots. We have a campground available for your needs.
- The only permitted signs are a "For Sale" sign on a home, or a Lot identification sign that meets requirements.
- Waterfront property owners: Before making changes to your shoreline of any kind (clear cutting, structures, rip rap, etc.) you must check with the proper authority. (Sauk County, DNR, and/or the Association.)
- No ATV's on the DHL Trail.
- Dogs must be leashed, or kept on your property. (Neighbors please be neighborly first and discuss issues. If difficulty continues contact the proper authorities.)
- No pets allowed inside the DHL gates which includes the clubhouse and beach area.
- No tree cutting/brush cutting on the greenway without the written permission of the Association.
- No driving on the grass at the clubhouse.
- There is a speed limit at the gate through the clubhouse parking lot. Important to follow!
- Most structures at DHL require a permit from the Architectural Control Committee. Please inquire before beginning a project.

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2024 MEMBERS ACTIVITY FEE SUMMARY

TENNIS/PICKLEBALL COURTS

\$5/court hour, or \$80/season

SWIMMING POOL

\$10/person/day or \$125/family/season. Seasonal fee covers up to 8 family members or guests per day.

Guest passes will only be issued on a daily basis - no exceptions.

DOCKS

\$20/boat slip/day or \$525/marina boat slip/season \$555/subdv. boat slip/season (with approved application)

STORAGE

Summer (Apr. – Oct.): \$235/unit (outside fenced area) Winter (Oct. – Apr.): \$235/unit (outside fenced area); \$310/unit (indoor; sorry no pontoons or campers in indoor storage due to space limitations)

Storage is assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. Space is limited.

CAMPGROUND

Water/Electric sites: (All water/electric sites have a designated parking space, a picnic table, and a fire ring.)

Tent camping (on improved site): \$37/day, \$185/week

Camping trailer or Pop-up: \$50/day, \$250/week

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2024 GIVE A HOOT AND REBOOT CHALLENGE



The 2024 Give A Hoot And Reboot Six

Week Challenge ended February 17th with eight very successful participants. Participants needed to complete 150 minutes of cardio and 20 minutes of strength training per/week during this six week challenge. There were three meeting sessions during this challenge, but attendance was not required.

During these sessions along with a short workout, participants were educated on:

- the benefits of strength training,
- how to measure resting heartrate, target heartrate, and recovery heartrate,
- what is their personal target heartrate is based on their age, and how to use perceived exertion.
- goal setting, identifying obstacles, and planning on how to deal with these obsta-. cles,
- the stages of behavioral change and identifying where they are with making the behavioral change of exercise as a priority, and
- the pros and cons of different workout structures: group classes vs one-on-one, training with a partner, home vs gym workouts.

Participants were eligible to win many prizes at the start and end of the challenge. Passes to the LaValle Center for walking, resistance bands, stability ball, 400 State Bike Trail pass, class exercise card, and one-on-one training sessions were won.

A few participants took the time to provide feedback on this year's reboot challenge indicating they would recommend it to a friend. "It was flexible enough no matter where you were starting. It also allowed individuality in the workouts you chose to do." "I was able to get back to a routine of working out many days throughout the week."

Nature Trail News

The daylight hours are becoming longer, and the temps are warming, that can mean one thing— Spring is Upon Us!!! My thoughts and urges are taking me outdoors to my gardens. My goal this year is to

attract more butterflies to my gardens by expanding, adding more color, features and specific plantings.

Host Plants/Nectar Plants

Butterflies lay their eggs on host plants. The resulting caterpillars then eat the leaves. Visit gardenswithwings.com and type in your zip code. You will find an illustrated list of butterflies in your area, the host and nectar plants you will need to attract those butterflies. Looks like I'll be adding more milkweed variety host plants and coneflowers, Mexican sunflowers and zinnias as nectar plants for attracting those monarchs.



Resting Places

Butterflies like a place to rest and bask in the sun. Flat smooth stones provide a spot for them to rest and warm their wings for flight.

Water Options

Butterflies often mingle on wet sand and mud to "puddle"; drink water and extract minerals from damp areas on the ground. Prepare a "puddling area" in your garden for butterflies. Place coarse sand in a shallow pan and insert the pan into the soil. Be sure to keep the sand moist. A birdbath is also a good water source for butterflies.

PLEASE AVOID INSECTICIDES

These products kill insects, like caterpillars, butterflies and bees.

Should I Clean up My Garden Early?

There is a very good reason to wait on cleaning your garden – pollinators. Many pollinators, like bees and butterflies, overwinter in dead plant material. They ride out the cold weather there and emerge in spring to do their good work.

By removing dead material too early, you risk destroying many of these pollinators. A good rule of thumb is to wait until temperatures are consistently about 50 degrees F. This will help protect habitat in the spring and ensure you have a robust and healthy pollinator population and overall garden ecosystem.
