Lake Shore Assistance Program
Deadline 10/31/23!

Sauk County's \$2,500 [Lake Shore Assistance Program](#) continues to gain momentum. We are pleased to announce that Sauk County is applying for a county wide [Healthy Lakes & Rivers](#) grant to expand eligible best management practices (BMP), and offer more financial and technical assistance to waterfront property owners. If we are successful applicants could receive up to \$1,000 per healthy lakes BMP. A requirement of grant-funded projects is a signed contract stating the shoreland property owner will maintain the project for at least 10-years.

The first step would be filling out the Sauk County cost share applications linked below by **October 31st 2023** (2024 install)

If you elect to participate in, and are successful in securing Sauk County funds, County staff would come back out and survey the property and create a design that meets the funding requirements. Staff would also need to approve all material before, during and after installation. Then reimbursement occurs.

Oh Deer!!!



Deer – love ‘em or hate ‘em, we’ve got ‘em. As we enter the fall and winter seasons, it seems like a good time to brush up on deer facts and also deer regulations.

Wild white-tailed deer have an average life span of 5 years, with males tending to have a shorter lifespan by about 2 years on average. The shorter life span for males is because they need to consume more calories than females, hunting preferences and the behavior differences between them.

A male deer’s antlers grow during summer due to a lack of testosterone, triggered by photoperiod, (the physiological reaction to the length of night or a dark period). A whitetail buck needs antlers for several reasons, and the bigger the better. Antlers help a buck establish breeding rights and defend his territory. Once late summer hits, a buck’s testosterone levels rise, which constricts blood flow to the velvet-covered antlers until, typically in early September, the antler hardens and pulls away from the velvet, causing an itchy sensation that encourages bucks to rub that velvet off. From this time through the rut, buck testosterone continues to rise, keeping the antlers securely fixed to their heads, where they’ll stay as long as there are does coming into heat. But once breeding is done, bucks simply do not need their antlers anymore. With daylight or photoperiod increasing, their body will decrease testosterone production and shedding will begin. Some folks actively search for these “sheds”, especially the larger ones.

Deer have adapted physiologically and behaviorally to survive the rigorous winters of Wisconsin. They are less active and feed less during late December to late February. While it may be tempting to “help” them by feeding them, feeding deer is prohibited in Sauk and surrounding counties. This ban is mainly due to CWD (Chronic Wasting Disease) and was put in place by the DNR (Department of Natural Resources).

And speaking of things that are not allowed, hunting is not allowed within Dutch Hollow, as we are considered a residential area.

As for your landscaping efforts, deer will generally avoid plants with a strong aroma. The key word there is “generally”. If they are hungry enough, they will eat almost anything – just ask my “eaten down to the ground” bearded iris, which they supposedly don’t care for. If you would be heartbroken to lose a particular plant, or if it needs time to grow out of a deer’s reach, fencing is your friend. Commercial deer repellent or a sprinkling of cayenne pepper also works well but will need to be reapplied after rain.

And now if there was only an effective deer repellent for our vehicles – but there’s not. So, it’s up to us to be very observant and to avoid speeding. Realize that, if you see a fawn (baby deer), the mother is probably nearby. I wish there were a foolproof method for avoiding them, but there’s not. Caution and common sense are your best defense.

So, treat our fascinating friends safely and with respect and we’ll all enjoy them.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE RESOLUTION

PURPOSE

In order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Dutch Hollow Lake, to maintain the desirability, amenities and property values of Dutch Hollow Lake, and to protect and enhance the natural beauty of Dutch Hollow Lake in furtherance of the foregoing objectives, the following property maintenance resolution is hereby established for all properties at Dutch Hollow Lake.

In the event that a dispute arises as to the interpretation of any of the following terms within the context of any particular matter that may be affected by this resolution, the property owner may submit the particular matter directly to the Board of Directors of the Dutch Hollow Lake Property Owners Association for review and final determination.

GENERAL MAINTENANCE

Every property owner of Dutch Hollow Lake shall maintain their property in compliance with the following general guidelines:

The exterior of every structure shall be maintained generally free of broken glass, loose shingles, excessive paint peeling, crumbling stone, stucco or brick, loose boards or any other such conditions reflective of deterioration or inadequate and/or deferred maintenance. Lots shall be kept clean and free from any unsightly accumulation of debris, cut brush or refuse.

All non-paved yard areas shall be maintained in grass, other vegetative groundcover, or trees and shrubs. Such groundcover, trees and shrubs shall be kept maintained, and all yard areas that consist of grass lawn shall be maintained continually in a neat and groomed manner.

Nothing in this resolution shall be construed so as to affect the change or require the change of any natural forested areas, greenways and/or shoreline areas throughout Dutch Hollow Lake.

OUTDOOR STORAGE OF VEHICLES, EQUIPMENT, AND OTHER MATERIALS

For purposes of this section, the following terms shall be generally defined as follows:

CATEGORY 1:

Category 1 shall mean commercial vehicles other than automobiles, commercial equipment, and any other vehicles or equipment of a similar nature.

“Commercial vehicle” means any vehicle or trailer owned or used by any resident of Dutch Hollow Lake for any commercial purpose whose vehicle is designed, used and maintained for the transportation of persons and/or property for hire, compensation, profit, or in the furtherance of any commercial enterprise.

Outdoor storage or outdoor parking of Category 1 items shall be prohibited at all times.

CATEGORY 2:

Category 2 shall mean automobiles, trucks, tractors, lawn care equipment, trailers, and/or any other vehicles or equipment of a similar nature that are not in regular use, or are under repair, and any other vehicles or equipment of a similar nature.

The terms “not in regular use” and “under repair” are to be

interpreted in their ordinary sense, and are not limited to a specific period of time. However, vehicles or equipment of a similar nature shall be conclusively presumed to be “not in regular use” or “under repair” for purposes of this definition if they are not either (1) driven away, (2) towed, or (3) pushed from the property on which they are located at least once in any 30 day period.

Outdoor storage and/or outdoor parking of any unlicensed, unregistered, inoperable, dismantled, wrecked or junk vehicle(s) or equipment is expressly prohibited.

Outdoor storage or outdoor parking of Category 2 items shall be prohibited at all times.

CATEGORY 3:

Category 3 shall mean recreational vehicles, recreational equipment such as piers, lifts, rafts; boats, jet skis, and any other water-related vehicles; motorcycles, snowmobiles, golf carts, all-terrain vehicles, four-wheel drive off-road vehicles, and any other vehicles or equipment of a similar nature.

“Recreational vehicle” shall mean a vehicle or piece of equipment that can be towed, hauled, carried or driven, or that is designed to be transported on a highway and used as a temporary living accommodation for recreational camping and travel use, including, but not limited to, travel trailers, truck campers, tent trailers, camping trailers, and self-propelled motor homes.

Outdoor storage or outdoor parking of Category 3 items shall be prohibited at all times EXCEPT that outdoor storage or outdoor parking of such items is allowed if all of the following conditions are met:

The item must be located on a property owners property;
All such items shall be neatly arranged;
All such items shall be placed in such a way as to minimize visual obstruction from adjacent properties.

CATEGORY 4:

Category 4 shall mean all other equipment and unsightly materials that are plainly visible and not specifically addressed in Categories 1, 2, or 3.

“Plainly visible” shall mean that something is readily seen at or beyond the boundaries of the property on which it is located, from a location where persons are normally or occasionally present (including, but not limited to, any point on Dutch Hollow Lake), provided the following apply:

It is not difficult to see;
It is readily noticeable to an ordinary observant person;
It is obvious to the eye;
It tends to attract attention by reason of size, brilliance, contrast, color, or location.

Outdoor storage or outdoor parking of Category 4 items shall be prohibited at all times.
